A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

With fall comes an uptick in most of our programs. It is a good time to consider if any of you might be a good fit for some of our activities. Some of our teams have become a bit sparse, and could use some new blood.

Let's start with our funeral reception team. Often when a member schedules a funeral at St. Paul's, they plan to use the Fellowship Hall for a gathering after. This involves setting up tables and chairs, putting on coffee, and, often, preparing desserts. This assumes that the main meal is catered. Sometimes they ask us to put on the meal. Obviously, that involves much more effort. The team that does this is getting older, smaller, and most of them are also busy with other church affairs. We're looking for 3 or 4 more helpers who can be available on short notice to help with these things. Please call me or Paula if interested.

Similarly, we have a couple teams that go to the Community Kitchen about 3 times per year each. Sometimes due to vacations or illness, etc. one of the teams is pretty short handed. This is an occasional and predictable schedule always on a Sunday. Let me know if you'd be interested.

Third, our altar guild - the group that sets up and cleans up the altar for worship could use some more help. They would train you and you usually work with another person as a team. Jeanette Richard leads this team and would love to hear from you.

Meal Train is another occasional ministry. Sometimes a member needs rides or meals or some other support, usually related to medical issues. Bonnie Schaff leads this. When a need arises, she sends out a notice on the computer and people respond as to their availability. This happens 3 or 4 times a year and is a great opportunity to care in practical ways for our fellow members.






A CAPPELLA CHOIR


Do you like to sing? Can you carry a tune?


