A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

A blessed Advent and Christmas from Amy and myself to you all! We are both deeply grateful for all your support and genuine warmth. It is a great blessing to serve you here at St. Paul's.

We hope you can all find some sense of peace, joy, and hope during this festive season. Advent is a time for two kinds of preparation. Christians around the world remember and contemplate the meaning of the birth of Jesus. What we understand as the Incarnation is the point in history in which the fullness of God's saving work enters our world in the flesh of a human being. In Jesus, God will heal, feed, teach, and finally redeem our fallen race. In Jesus, the distance between humanity and divinity is forever closed. We are drawn by God's grace back into an intimate and eternal relationship that is nothing less than a fully new life. In Advent, we get ready to celebrate that great miracle, and during Christmas, we do just that - celebrate holy love, embodied in the person of Jesus, that makes all things new.

While we are being renewed in the message of the Gospel, we are also preparing for our own particular traditions. Some of us will travel to be with loved ones. The parish will observe all this in a few ways. We will have our own outdoor tree lit for all passers by to see. Our members will decorate our inside tree on Monday, December 1. The Connecticut Yankee Chorale will present their holiday concert at 4pm, Sunday December 7. We will offer a service called Blue Christmas/Longest Night at 4pm, Sunday, December 21. This quiet, contemplative service is especially helpful for those who are dealing with grief or sorrow in the midst of the season's joy. Our children's pageant will be Sunday morning, the 21st. We'll offer 2 Christmas Eve services, one at 10am for those who do not drive at night, and one at 4pm with candlelight. Both will feature many favorite carols. The Sunday after Christmas, the 28th, will be a lay-led service of Lessons and Carols at our normal 10am time. We will celebrate Epiphany on January 4.

We wish you all the most uplifting and positive experiences as you decide which of these good events to attend. Through it all, may God's peace fill your homes and hearts, and may the Holy Infant's birth deepen your faith and love.
