A Word from Pastor Cady

Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

Fall is soon upon us, bringing some new and exciting events. One is the influx of newer members. We received some on August 30, and we will be receiving more later in September. It's gratifying to welcome newer folks into our family of faith. As they begin to get involved, please make them feel at home and get to know them.

Another is a new fundraising opportunity that should be fun for us as well to help connect to the community in ways we have not done before. I'm referring to the Pumpkin Patch project. On October 3rd sometime mid-day we'll receive a truck load of pumpkins to sell to the public each day during October. They are grown by a Navaho group in the southwest. They are pre-priced and ready to sell. When the sale is over, we send them a portion of the income, and we keep the rest. Unsold pumpkins can be given away to local farmers as feed for their animals. We are not charged for unsold stock. So, Pumpkin Patch USA win, we win, and the farmer who gets the free pumpkins wins. In the meantime, we have attracted the attention of many new community members. Please spread the word about this and sign up for a short shift to help sell. The sign-up sheet will be available in the Narthex each Sunday for you to sign up. We're looking for at least 2 people to sign up for each shift so you're not alone. The shifts are 11am-3pm and 3pm-7pm. Any questions, please contact Lisa Bodnar or Kathy Craig in the office during the week.

Of course, we also have our traditional fall events like the First Communion class (September 12, 9-noon), and Rally Day, which kicks off our Sunday School and Confirmation year, (September 20). We'll also use Rally Day to get a nice group picture of our congregation from the loft to use in publicity and outreach.

For those of you who have used summer to travel, camp, or otherwise recreate, please return refreshed and committed to our common ministry to our own members, and to our wider community. There is some real momentum at St. Paul's, with many opportunities for you to bring your gifts to bear. We'd love to include some new members in our committees and groups - Altar Guild, Soup Kitchen, Sunday School staff, Fellowship Committee, Finance, IT, Council, Worship and Music, Evangelism, Choir, either a cappella or the contemporary group, Women's group, Quilting group, Tai Chi, Property, Bible study, and more. When we work together, we build up the Body of Christ in ways that create an ever more effective church.

The blessings of God are many and varied. Let us open ourselves to them in all the ways we can, for the sake of ourselves and our neighbors.

FROM FINANCE

To my Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Finance committee prays this finds you safe and restored after the last days of summer. I would like to give you an update on where we stand as August.

In this update, I will briefly summarize our year-to-date financial position, explain an important timing issue with school revenue, and invite continued faithful stewardship as we move into the final quarter of the year.

Through August 18, the table below compares our actual income and expenses with the amounts budgeted for this point in the year.

	Actual	Budgeted	Difference	% of Budget used to Date
Total Income To date	\$284,210.80	\$376,859.00	-\$92,648.20	75.42%
Total Expenses to date	\$305,851.00	\$457,658.00	-\$156,703.60	66.83%
Net Operating Income	-\$21,648.20	-\$80,799.00	\$50,158.80	26.78%

A few things to point out: Hilltop has been out of session since mid-June, and the first bills for the new school year went out in August.

Sunday offerings are currently at 66% of what was budgeted for the year, and at this pace we should surpass the budgeted amount. At the same time, we need to strengthen this number so we can cover our expenses without relying too heavily on fundraisers, special gifts, or use-of-facility income, all of which could change or disappear at any time.

As we enter the final quarter, I ask each of us to prayerfully consider how we can continue supporting the ministries and financial health of our church through consistent giving.
