# A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

The moving and powerful seasons of Advent and Christmas have come around again. This is a time of festivity, family, food, and faith. There are beloved carols, candles, religious and secular gatherings, glistening and creative decorations, and reminders of the astonishing grace of a God who would enter our world as a simple infant for our salvation.

There are some common pitfalls this season, too. It is easy to become too frenetic in our preparations for Christmas. It is easy to overspend, overeat, and to hold ourselves or our neighbors to an unrealistic standard of what a "good Christmas" looks like. And, even though this whole set of traditions centers on Christ, it is actually easy to be so wrapped up (pun intended) in our Christmas activities that the central message of the Incarnation might receive less attention than it merits.

Here is my best pastoral advice: Before it all gets out of hand, just take a bit of time to ask yourself which of your past practices are truly joyous witnesses to God's glorious and healing work in the Nativity. And which things you've done in past years have left you feeling weary, disappointed, over stressed, or down. Lift up the joyous activities and eliminate or modify the ones that have not proven to be meaningful. There is no one right way for a person or household to celebrate these days. And in the flow of our lives, events that were once important may have been replaced by other kinds of activities.

The world changed when the Son of God became the Son of Man at Bethlehem. May our hearts and lives continue to be changed for the better as we again surround ourselves with reminders of His life-giving birth.



## Music Moment with Marcia



Thank you all for the opportunity to serve as your Music Director and for all the positive feedback you have offered thus far! It is a joy and a blessing to be "on the bench" at St. Paul's Lutheran, Torrington, and to be part of such an active and welcoming congregation!

Recently as I left work in Ansonia and turned on my radio (set to Sirius XM's Symphony Hall station #76), I heard the phrases of a somewhat familiar orchestral piece by César Franck, his Symphony in D minor. I hadn't heard it in a very long time, having become acquainted with it my freshman year of college at Adrian College, Adrian, Michigan where I began my pursuit of a degree in interior design. As a fairly good clarinetist in high school (by rural north central Ohio standards), I thought it would be nice to join the Adrian Symphony, which included a combination of area students and musicians. Hearing the feedback after my audition, it was clear that I had opportunity for improvement, and while I was not offered one of the two chairs as clarinetist, the conductor DID offer me the chair for BASS clarinetist, which I had never really played. The fingering is the same, though, so my biggest challenge was the struggle to achieve a good smooth tone on the available instrument. I tried different reeds, practiced by myself for what seemed like hours upon hours (though I am sure I could have done more), and yet I was never fully satisfied with the result. I could not seem to execute at a professional level what the piece required. I did not sign up for the Adrian Symphony for my second semester. I AM thankful for the opportunity to have been a part of the performance of this Symphony which my parents came to hear, and to hear other musicians who were at a higher level than myself. I suppose that my contribution to the performance filled a need which would have otherwise been vacant and, therefore, provided a fuller, richer tone in those passages where the bass clarinetist was featured.

At our recent Community Thanksgiving Service, I was truly blessed to sit back and listen to the wonderful variety of music offered by others. This service was richer and fuller with the participation of many others than it would have been on our own. This sense of teamwork and camaraderie in creating something larger than the sum of its parts is what I really enjoyed about playing in high school concert and marching bands, and our local New Washington Band. Although I also once again experienced a sense of some of the opportunity I have in developing my own ability, I will leave you with the following thought once shared with me. "If only the prettiest-singing birds of the forest sang, it would be a quiet forest indeed."

I invite instrumentalists at any level to participate in making our worship at St. Paul's fuller and richer. Please let me know if you would like to provide special music, whether as a soloist or as part of an ensemble!


