### A Word from Pastor Cady



Dear Members and Friends of St. Paul's,

June has a couple important dates. The first that touches the lives of our own young members is Confirmation during worship on June 4, which is also the Feast of the Holy Trinity. Celebrating our youth on their journey of faith is a high privilege. Confirmation is an event with a double meaning. It is a confirming, or a kind of re-affirmation, of the promises made for these students when they were baptized. They were named as citizens of the Kingdom of God and siblings within the worldwide family of faith. It is also a public declaration by the youth of their own maturing commitment to be disciples of Jesus. We are deeply moved by both God's promise and their embrace of that promise.

It is also the beginning of the long green liturgical season of Pentecost. The church calendar is roughly divided into two halves. From the end of November to May there is a whole series of festivals. Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and the seven-week Easter Season help us observe and commemorate the birth, death, and resurrection of our Lord. The second half of the year, known as the Season of Pentecost, is mostly focused on the teachings of Jesus and the responses of the disciples to his divine wisdom. We do well to hear these stories as if we were among those who were first hearing them. Christ's message is intended for every generation and is surely the most important guidance for all our lives.

June 18 is Fathers' Day. As the role of parents continues to evolve, both Mothers' Day and Fathers' Day are worthy of our reflection. Family life is a great blessing, but it is also challenging. Dads and Stepdads need lots of support to fulfill their roles well. The day also brings out all the emotions around our relationship to our own fathers, both good and difficult. Those of us who were blessed with good fathers do well to recall their best traits and the ways they shaped our lives. Those who whose fathers were not up to the job will need to make sure they do not replicate the harmful patterns they were subjected to. And when we are aware of families in which there is no functioning father, those of us who are brothers, uncles, or even neighbors, might be able to offer occasional role modeling.

June 27 is the Observance of the Presentation of the Augsburg Confession. For those not well informed about Lutheran history, this document is a critical part of our identity. Luther and his friends and followers had been critiquing and reforming many facets of church life for more than a decade when they finally had an opportunity to present their perspective in a formal statement to the secular and religious authorities. The meeting was held in the city of Augsburg at the end of June, 1530. It was tense. If those who were present were judged to be heretics, they could have been executed. It was too dangerous for Luther himself to be present, so a younger colleague of his named Philip Melancthon was the main author and presenter. The statement claims that nothing the reformers were teaching was opposed to the classic faith of the church. They believed that they were faithful Christians who should be allowed to make some changes that were not fundamentally unbiblical or damaging to Christian tradition. They intended to remain within the Roman Catholic Church while still being allowed to alter some practices. Their declaration was rejected, but the presenters were too well regarded to be put to death. So they were excommunicated. From that time, the movement they had been leading became a separated Christian community. After a time, despite Luther's opposition, the movement took the name "Lutheran." It quickly spread north to encompass what is now northern Germany, Denmark, Norway, Sweden, Finland, and parts of the Baltic nations. The Augsburg Confession remains today a classic statement of faith that all Lutherans around the world accept.



### The Northwest Hills Refugee Resettlement Committee Welcomes a Refugee Family From Syria to Torrington, CT


Following the fall of Afghanistan to the Taliban in August 2021, a group of churches and individuals living in Litchfield County CT headed up by Pastor Sara Khrla, UCC Goshen CT and Pastor Scott Cady, St. Pauls' Evangelical Lutheran Church in Torrington, CT formed a

group called the Northwest Hills Refugee Resettlement Committee (NWHRRC) to bring refugees from Afghanistan to CT. About the same time several women of St. Paul's', who were quilters, came together to make quilts for the incoming refugees.

After many months of extremely hard work the NHWRRC welcomed a refugee family of 7 from the Middle East, who had spent several years in a refugee camp in Lebanon, to Torrington, CT the first week in April. The family moved into its apartment around April 15, 2023.
